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### Anticipation Reaction Guide

An Anticipation/Reaction Guide utilizes a twin strategy to increase reading comprehension: stimulate prior knowledge and experiences before reading and then reinforce key concepts after reading. The guide presents students with a series of leading questions to be answered in writing before reading.

### Anticipation/Reaction Guide - Reading Educator

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.

The Anticipation/Reaction Guide helps students activate and evaluate prior knowledge. Students make predictions based upon background knowledge and evaluate these predictions after exposure to new information.
