If you are working in acute rehab with patients with brain injury, you will learn quickly that the patient's brain will very likely not be "healed" to its full potential. Hospital stays are usually one to three weeks and the brain can heal for up to 12 months or more. This of course varies for each person.

Behavior can be affected by a brain injury in many ways, creating challenges for the individual receiving the injury as well as for loved ones and family. The role of the behavior analyst can often make a difference in recovery because behavioral strategies can address many of the different facets that enhance better outcomes.

Significant behavioral/emotional difficulties may respond to medications in combination with behavior-based interventions and strategies. Psychiatrists and/or psychiatrists experienced in treatment of TBI may recommend medications for reducing agitation/anger, depression, emotional lability.

Behavioral momentum is another strategy that has been used to increase positive behaviors and compliance in brain injury rehabilitation (Slifer et al., 1997). Behavior momentum involves making requests with which the students have a high probability of compliance before making a low-probability

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request—similar to the momentum of objects in motion.

Pharmacological interventions The existing literature on the efficacy of pharmacologic treatment of depression after TBI is limited to small studies varying widely in design, diagnostic and outcome assessment, severity of brain injury, and time post-injury.
