Similarly, bilingual children with speech and language disorders learn

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two languages relatively slower and perhaps not to the same level as their typically developing bilingual peers, but they match their monolingual peers with a speech and language disorder, if given similar opportunities.

If the child has a language disorder then their language skills are considered to be below average for each spoken language. A multilingual child with a language disorder will also most likely have different proficiencies across spoken languages. Cummins (1984) distinguished between two types of language proficiencies:

Learning Two Languages - American Speech-Language ...

The vocabularies of English-Chinese bilingual children with ASD and monolingual children with ASD were compared in a study [5]. The authors concluded that bilingualism did not have a negative effect on the children's language development, as both groups had similar vocabulary scores.

A clear understanding of how to best provide clinical services to bilingual children with suspected or confirmed primary language impairment (PLI) is predicated on understanding typical development in dual-language learners as well as the PLI profile.

Bilingual Children with Primary Language Impairment ...

Just like some monolingual children have a language delay or disorder, a similar proportion of bilinguals will have a language delay or disorder. Evidence that one bilingual child has a language difficulty,

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however, is not evidence that bilingualism leads to language difficulties in general.
