Evaluation of the outcome of evidence-based practice decisions in individual patients or patient groups is step five in the evidence-based practice approach. Outcome measures are any measures that reflect patient status. Status or outcome measures can be used to detect change over time (eg, treatment effects), to discriminate among clinical groups, or to predict future outcomes (eg, return to work).

Evidence-based practice (EBP) is the objective, balanced, and responsible use of current research and the best available data to guide policy and practice decisions, such that outcomes for consumers are improved.

Outcomes research seeks to understand the end results of particular health care practices and interventions. End results include effects that people experience and care about, such as change in the ability to function.

According to the manual Evidence-Based Practice Manual: Research and Outcome Measures in Health and Human Services, "Evidence-based healthcare expresses commitment to improve the transparency of reasoning behind policies, increase accountability by justifying decisions on the basis of valid information that can stand up to scrutiny, gauge uncertainty by making explicit the strength of evidence supporting policy, and make policy decisions driven by the best outcomes for the healthcare dollar."

Evidence Based Practice. Form of experimental research used to assess the relative effect of a specific intervention compared to a control condition. Pts are randomized into a control group and at least one experimental group. The control group receives either no treatment or a standard default treatment.

Nursing research, evidence-based practice, and quality improvement (QI) each play an important, and complementary, role in improving patient outcomes. Nursing research is a systematic investigation that includes development, testing, and evaluation.

Evidence-based practice in a clinical setting

The process of evidence-based research in complementary and alternative medicine. The panel of experts who performs the systematic review drafts the consensus statement. It is then presented and discussed in an open forum to patient group advocates and the general public.

The fifth step of the process, outcome evaluation, attempts to interpret the results and evaluate the outcomes of the applied evidence (intervention). Outcome measures may be psychosocial (quality of life, improved patient perception of care, reduction in depressive and anxiety symptoms), physiologic (improved health, reduced complications), or ...

Evidence-Based Practice Tools - APTA

Evidence-based practice requires application of practices for which the evidence was the product of rigorous scientific empirical studies - that is, outcome research. Outcome research is the domain and responsibility of trained researchers, who are usually employed in university settings.

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
