Fluency Building Fluency Building. Fluency building is a group of printable or projectable activities where

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students can do timed readings of sounds, words, and connected text. During one-minute stints, students are challenged to meet specific targets (for example, reading 40 words in one minute) to help improve fluency.

The type of progress monitoring measure a teacher uses will depend on the student's instructional level rather than his or her grade level. For example, a third-grade student reading at a third-grade instructional level might be administered a passage reading fluency measure (or probe).
