Gastric stump cancer (GSC) is a separate subtype of GC, defined as a carcinoma that occurs in the gastric remnant 5 years after the surgery for peptic ulcer.<sup>64</sup> GSC represents from 1.1% to 7% of all GCs (Figure 1), and males are more prone to them than woman.<sup>55,65,66</sup> Gastrectomy is a well-established risk factor for GSC, even long time after the initial surgery.<sup>50</sup> ...

A stomach cancer or gastric cancer almost always is an adenocarcinoma. These cancers develop from the cells that line the innermost lining of the stomach (the mucosa).
