The style of Climacus varies from each of the three productions, but they are singular as to their dialectical mission.

It was the second of three works written under the pseudonym Johannes Climacus ; the other two were De omnibus dubitandum est in 1841 and Concluding Unscientific Postscript to Philosophical Fragments in 1846.
