On the Fort Union site in 1985, the Fort Union Muzzle Loaders Association (FUMLA) reconstructed a 63-foot tall flagpole similar to the one Fort Union Bourgeois Edwin Denig had described in 1843. A decade later, Fort Union clerk and artist Rudolph F. Kurz sketched that flagpole.
